ANNA APPLE Remarkable fruit for mild-winter climates in So. Calif., So. Ariz. Heavy crops of sweet, crisp, flavorful apples even in low desert. Fresh/cooked. Keeps 2 mos. in refrigerator. 200 hours. Self-fruitful or pollinized by Dorsett Golden or Einshemer.

DORSETT GOLDEN APPLE Outstanding sweet apple for warm winter areas. Firm, very flavorful, sweet like Golden Delicious. Productive throughout So. California and Phoenix, Arizona. Good early season sweet apple for Central Calif. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

FUJI APPLE Recent introduction from Japan that quickly became California's favorite apple. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Dull reddish-orange skin, sometimes russeted. Ripe mid-September. Excellent pollinizer for other apple varieties. Low chilling requirement - less than 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

GALA APPLE (Original Gala) Wonderful dessert apple from New Zealand. Crisp, nice blend of sweetness and tartness, rich flavor. Skin reddish-orange over yellow. Early harvest, 2-3 weeks before Red Delicious. Good pollinizer for other varieties. Adapted to cold and warm-winter climates. Chilling requirement apparently less than 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

GRANNY SMITH APPLE From New Zealand. Large, late, green, all-purpose. Crisp, tart, excellent keeper. Requires long summer. Thrives in hot climates. 600 hours. Prolonged bloom: good pollinizer for other apples. Self-fruitful.

PINK LADY® APPLE (Cripps Pink) New hot climate apple from Western Australia. Very crisp, sweet-tart, distinct flavor, good keeper. Skin reddish-pink over green when ripe. White flesh resists browning. Harvest begins late October in Central Calif., about three weeks after Fuji. Self-fruitful. 4-500 hours. Pat. No. 7880.

BLNHEIM (ROYAL) APRICOT All-purpose freestone, sweet, aromatic, flavorful. Long-time No. 1 apricot in California. Early bloom. Late June harvest in Central Calif. 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

KATY APRICOT Large, all-purpose flavorful freestone. Tree-ripe fruit is subacid (not tart). A favorite apricot for warm-winter climates. Early harvest, 3-4 weeks before Blenheim (Royal). 400 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 4339. (Zaiger)

MOORPARK APRICOT Long-time favorite of apricot fanciers for its exceptionally rich flavor and aroma. Reliable producer. Used fresh and for canning. 600 hours. Self-fruitful.

LAPINS CHERRY New, from Canada. Self-fruitful, dark red sweet cherry. Large, firm, good flavor. Similar to Van in color, Stella in shape. Sometimes sold as "Self-fertile Bing." Ripens 4 days after Bing. 500 hours.

MINNIE ROYAL CHERRY Medium-sized red cherry; firm with good flavor. Ripens 11-14 days ahead of Bing. Tree is very productive with a low chill requirement; mainly used as a pollinizer for Royal Lee. pollinized by Royal Lee. Est. Chill 2-300 hours. US Plant Patent # 12942 (Zaiger)

MONTMORENCY SOUR CHERRY Large, light red skin, yellow flesh. Perfect for cobblers, pies, etc. Extremely winter hardy. Very heavy bearing. 700 hours. Self-fruitful.

ROYAL LEE CHERRY Medium-large cherry; heart shaped, very firm with excellent flavor; ripens 11-14 days ahead of Bing. Tree is very productive with a low chill requirement. pollinized by Minnie Royal. Est. Chill 200-300 hours. US Plant Patent # 12472. (Zaiger)

DESERT DAWN NECTARINE Proven heavy producer of delicious nectarines for warm winter western climates. Solid red skin, juicy yellow semi-freestone, rich flavor. Mid to late May. 250 hours. Self-fruitful. (Zaiger)

DESERT DELIGHT NECTARINE Proven producer in warm winter climates, and highly recommended as an early season nectarine elsewhere. Large fruit with bright red skin, yellow flesh and delicious, rich, nectarine flavor. Harvest mid-June in Central Calif. 1-200 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 7891. (Zaiger)

DOUBLE DELIGHT NECTARINE Sensational fruit - consistently the best-flavored yellow nectarine - plus magnificent, double pink flowers. Dark red-skinned, freestone fruit is sweet, with unusually rich flavor - very high-scoring in taste tests. Heavy-bearing tree. Harvest early to mid-July in Central Calif. 300 hours. Self-fruitful. (Zaiger)

FANTASIA NECTARINE Popular, large, yellow freestone. Early harvest fruit is firm-ripe and tangy, later harvest is sweet, with rich flavor: high-scoring in taste tests. Late July/early August in Central Calif. 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

LATE LEGRAND NECTARINE Old favorite yellow-fleshed nectarine. Richly flavored, still one of the best. Very high taste test scores. Attractive red and yellow skin. Harvest mid to late-August in Central Calif. 600 hours. Self-fruitful.

PANAMINT NECTARINE Attractive red-skinned yellow freestone. Aromatic, intensely flavored, nice acid-sugar balance. Dependable, long-time favorite in warm winter Southern California climates. Late July/early August. 250 hours. Self-fruitful.

ARCTIC SUPREME WHITE PEACH Two-time taste test winner. Large, white flesh, nearly freestone when fully ripe. Red over cream colored skin. Sweet and tangy, fine delicate flavor, firm texture. Peak quality reached a short while after picking. Harvest late July/early August in Central Calif. 700 hours. Self-fruitful. (Zaiger)

AUGUST PRIDE PEACH Large, all-purpose yellow freestone for mild- winter climates. Sweet, aromatic, rich flavor, one of the very best. Ripens 3-4 weeks after Mid-Pride. Chilling requirement less than 300 hours. Self-fruitful. (Zaiger)

BONITA PEACH Medium to large yellow freestone with red blush. Sweet, subacid, very flavorful. Proven variety for So. Calif., coast or inland. Late July. Chilling req. less than 400 hours. Self-fruitful.

DONUT (Stark Saturn) WHITE PEACH Also called Saucer or Peento Peach. Unique white-fleshed fruit with a sunken center (shaped like a doughnut). Sweet, with a mild flavor described by some as almond-like. Ripens late June/early July in Central Calif. Estimated chilling requirement 4-500 hours. Self-fruitful.

EVA'S PRIDE PEACH Delicious, fine-flavored peach with very low-chilling requirement ripens 2-3 weeks before Mid-Pride. Medium to large-sized yellow freestone - also recommended as early season peach for moderate climates - harvest 3 weeks before July Elberta. 1-200 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 7751. (Zaiger)

MID-PRIDE PEACH Best yellow freestone for warm winter climates of So. Calif., Phoenix, Houston, S.F. Bay Area. Also recommended for Central California for its exceptional flavor and dessert quality. Mid-season. 250 hours. Self-fruitful. (Zaiger)

O'HENRY PEACH Popular fresh market yellow freestone now available for home planting. Large, firm, full red skin, superb flavor. Ripens early to mid-August in Central Calif. Good for freezing. Strong, vigorous, heavy bearing tree. 750 hours. Self-fruitful.

RELIANCE PEACH Late blooming. Very cold hardy/frost hardy. Sweet, flavorful yellow freestone - best choice for climates having severe cold in winter and spring. Harvest 2-3 weeks before Elberta. Showy bloom. 1000 hours. Self-fruitful.

BARTLETT PEAR World's most popular pear. Early mid-season, high quality, tolerates hot summers. 800 hours. Self-fruitful in most climates of Western U.S. Elsewhere, pollenized by Bosc, D'Anjou, Winter Nelis.

20TH CENTURY ASIAN PEAR (Nijisseiki, "Apple Pear") Juicy, sweet, mild-flavored fruit is crisp like apple. Early to mid-August in Central Calif. Keeps well. Easy to grow, heavy bearing small tree. 450 hours. Self-fruitful or poll. by Shinseiki, Bartlett, or other.

SHINSEIKI ASIAN PEAR Juicy, sweet, refreshing, crisp like an apple. Easy to grow. Keeps well. Harvest late July/early August in Central Calif. Bright yellow skin. Vigorous, heavy bearing (usually by 2nd year). 350-450 hours. Self-fruitful.

BURGUNDY PLUM Maroon-colored skin and flesh. Sweet, with little or no tartness and a very pleasing, mild flavor. High taste test scores. Prolonged harvest, mid-July to mid-August in Central Calif. Very productive. Narrow, upright habit. 300 hours. Self-fruitful.

CATALINA PLUM Large, black, favorite fresh market plum. Sweet and juicy but still firm when fully ripe, with very little tartness at skin and pit. Very high taste test scores - one of the best plums for fresh-eating. Ripe late July in Central Calif. Vigorous, productive tree. 400 hours. Self-fruitful.

SANTA ROSA PLUM Most popular plum in California & Arizona. Juicy, tangy, flavorful. Reddish-purple skin, amber flesh tinged red. Late June in Central Calif. 300 hours. Self-fruitful.

ALL-IN-ONE GENETIC SEMI-DWARF ALMOND No. 1 almond for home orchards. Heavy crops of soft-shell nuts with sweet, flavorful kernels. Hot summer required to ripen. 15 ft. tree, very winter & frost hardy. 500 hrs. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 4304. (Zaiger)

PEDRO WALNUT Very small tree, less than 2/3 the size of other varieties. Well-sealed nut, similar to Payne, has perhaps the finest-flavored kernel - winner of consumer taste tests. Widely adapted, excellent choice for home planting. 400 hours. Self-fruitful. (Rootstock: NCB walnut.)

CLEVELAND SELECT FLOWERING PEAR *Pyrus calleryana* 'Cleveland Select' Pyramidal shape, grows to 25-30 ft. by 12-15 ft. Pure white blossoms. Glossy green, leathery foliage. Fall colors orange-red to purplish red. Apparently identical to 'Chanticleer.' Sunset zones 2-9, 14-21.

MODESTO ASH - *Fraxinus velutina glabra* Beautiful deciduous shade tree for arid climates - anthracnose fungus may be a problem elsewhere. Vigorous, to 50 ft tall and 30 ft wide. Spectacular yellow fall color. Sunset zones 3-24.

RAYWOOD ASH - *Fraxinus oxycarpa* 'Raywoodi' Fast-growing, tolerates heat, cold, alkaline soil. Compact, round-headed. Small, delicate leaves, lacy appearance. Purplish-red fall color. No seeds. 25-35 ft.

ALLEE® ELM - *Ulmus parvifolia* (Emer II). Upright grower to 45 - 65 feet. Tolerates a wide range of soil and weather extremes. Ideal street tree or other medium type planting. Zones 5-8.

GOLDEN RAIN TREE - *Koelreuteria paniculata* Slowly reaches 30 ft. x 30 ft. Open habit, gives light shade. Compound leaves, yellow flower clusters, ornamental seed pods. Tolerates heat, wind, drought, cold, alkaline soil. Sunset zones 2-21.

WASHINGTON HAWTHORN - *Crataegus phaenopyrum* Glossy green foliage, large clusters of small white flowers late spring/early summer. Red and orange fall color. Showy, bright red fruit in fall and winter. Less susceptible to fireblight than other hawthorns. Open growth habit to 25 ft. high, 20 ft. wide. Sunset zones 1-11, 14-17.

SHADEMASTER™ HONEYLOCUST - *Gleditsia tri. inermis* 'Shademaster' Very fast-growing, deciduous. Tolerates heat, cold, wind, drought, alkaline soil. Distinctive small leaflets, long seed pods. 50-60 ft. Sunset zones 1-16, 18-20.

PURPLE ROBE LOCUST - *Robinia idahoensis* 'Purple Robe' Shapely deciduous tree to 40 ft. Tolerates heat/cold/poor soil/drought. Small leaflets, reddish new growth. Large, purplish-pink showy flowers, prolonged bloom. Deep watering recommended. All zones.

BLOODGOOD LONDON PLANE - *Platanus acerfolia* 'Bloodgood' Fast-growing deciduous tree to 80 ft. Large maplelike leaves, distinctive patchy bark pattern. Resists anthracnose, tolerates smog. Very desirable for street, park, and lawn plantings. Sunset zones 2-24.

JAPANESE PAGODA TREE - *Sophora japonica* Attractive, trouble-free, deciduous. Oak-like bark, dark green leaflets. Interesting flower clusters and seed pods in late summer. Rapid growth when young, then more slowly to 40'x40'. Resists oak root fungus. All soils, all zones.

OKLAHOMA REDBUD - *Cercis canadensis* 'Oklahoma' Spectacular purplish-red flower clusters in early spring (after flowering plums, before flowering crabapples). Attractive tree with round-shaped canopy and glossy, heart-shaped leaves. Tolerates hot summers. Largest of the redbuds, to 30-35 ft. Sunset zones 1-3, 7-20.

WESTERN REDBUD - *Cercis occidentalis* Multi-trunked tree to 15' x 15. Spectacular bright purplish-pink sweet pea-shaped flowers. Yellow to red fall color. Drought tolerant, resistant to oak root fungus. Sunset zones 2-24.
