**ANNA APPLE** Remarkable fruit for mild-winter climates in So. Calif., So. Ariz. Heavy crops of sweet, crisp, flavorful apples even in low desert. Fresh/cooked. Keeps 2 mos. in refrigerator. 200 hours. Self-fruitful or pollinized by Dorsett Golden or Einshemer.

**DORSETT GOLDEN APPLE** Outstanding sweet apple for warm winter areas. Firm, very flavorful, sweet like Golden Delicious. Productive throughout So. California and Phoenix, Arizona. Good early season sweet apple for Central Calif. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**FUJI APPLE** Recent introduction from Japan that quickly became California's favorite apple. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Dull reddish-orange skin, sometimes russeted. Ripe mid-September. Excellent pollinizer for other apple varieties. Low chilling requirement - less than 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

**GALA APPLE (Original Gala)** Wonderful dessert apple from New Zealand. Crisp, nice blend of sweetness and tartness, rich flavor. Skin reddish-orange over yellow. Early harvest, 2-3 weeks before Red Delicious. Good pollinizer for other varieties. Adapted to cold and warm-winter climates. Chilling requirement apparently less than 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

**PINK LADY® APPLE (Cripps Pink)** New hot climate apple from Western Australia. Very crisp, sweet-tart, distinct flavor, good keeper. Skin reddish-pink over green when ripe. White flesh resists browning. Harvest begins late October in Central Calif., about three weeks after Fuji. Self-fruitful. 4-500 hours. Pat. No. 7880.

**PIXIE-COT GENETIC DWARF APRICOT** Compact tree with medium sized, fine quality fruit. The first genetic dwarf apricot that meets the "Flavor Test" at Dave Wilson Nursery. The fruit is ripe around June 1st in California's Central Valley. Estimated chill requirement 600 hours

**BLLENHEIM (ROYAL) APRICOT** All-purpose freestone, sweet, aromatic, flavorful. Long-time No. 1 apricot in California. Early bloom. Late June harvest in Central Calif. 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

**GOLD KIST APRICOT** Excellent backyard apricot for warm winter climates. Freestone, very good quality. Heavy bearing. Early harvest, 3-4 weeks before Blenheim (Royal). 300 hours. Self-fruitful.

**TOMCOT APRICOT** The most consistently productive apricot variety at Dave Wilson Nursery 1992-97. Large, orange fruit with firm, sweet flesh. Early harvest, 2-3 weeks before Wenatchee Moorpark. Originated at Prosser, WA, introduced in 1989. 600 hours. Partly self-fruitful; biggest crops if cross-pollinized by another apricot. Pat. No. 7034.

**CRAIG'S CRIMSON CHERRY** Taste test winner. Self-fruitful, natural semi-dwarf, perhaps the finest sweet cherry. Dark red to nearly black, medium to large size, wonderful spicy flavor, very firm texture. Mature tree size about 2/3 of standard (smaller when budded onto Colt or Mahaleb rootstock). Mid-season. 500-600 hours. Pat. No. 7320. (Zaiger)

**LAPINS CHERRY** New, from Canada. Self-fruitful, dark red sweet cherry. Large, firm, good flavor. Similar to Van in color, Stella in shape. Sometimes sold as "Self-fertile Bing." Ripens 4 days after Bing. 500 hours.

**MINNIE ROYAL CHERRY** Medium-sized red cherry; firm with good flavor. Ripens 11-14 days ahead of Bing. Tree is very productive with a low chill requirement; mainly used as a pollinizer for Royal Lee. pollinized by Royal Lee. Est. Chill 2-300 hours. US Plant Patent # 12942 (Zaiger)

**ROYAL LEE CHERRY** Medium-large cherry; heart shaped, very firm with excellent flavor; ripens 11-14 days ahead of Bing. Tree is very productive with a low chill requirement. pollinized by Minnie Royal. Est. Chill 200-300 hours. US Plant Patent # 12472. (Zaiger)

**ROYAL RAINIER CHERRY** Large yellow cherry with slightly more red blush than Rainier. Excellent flavor, taste test winner. Ripens early, about 3-5 days ahead of Rainier. Moderate chill requirement, (600-700 hrs. estimated). Pollinates with Bing and Black Tartarian, Stella & Van.

**STELLA CHERRY** Self-fruitful - no pollinizer needed. Large, nearly black, richly flavored sweet cherry similar to its parent, Lambert. Late harvest. 500-600 hours. Pollinates Bing, except in mild winter climates.

**CONTORTED JUJUBE** Interesting ornamental form: twisted, contorted branching. Round-shaped edible fruits similar to Li. Fruits reddish-brown when ripe, eaten firm and crunchy or room-dried to date-like chewy sweetness. Early fall harvest. Attractive, easy-to-grow tree: hardy, drought-resistant, virtually pest and disease free. Requires long, hot summer. Very low chilling requirement. Partly self-fruitful or pollinized by Lang.

**LI JUJUBE** Also called "Chinese date". Round-shaped fruits are larger than Lang. Reddish-brown, dry and wrinkled, sweet and chewy (like dates) when fully ripe in early Fall. Attractive, easy-to-grow tree: hardy, drought-resistant, virtually pest and disease free. Requires long, hot summer. Very low chilling requirement. Partly self-fruitful, or pollinized by Lang.

**BLACK JACK FIG** Large, purplish-brown figs with sweet, juicy, strawberry-red flesh. Harvest August to October in Central California. Naturally small (semi-dwarf) tree. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**CONADRIA FIG** Light greenish-yellow skin, pink flesh. Not as sweet as Kadota, but resists spoilage. Fresh/dried. Very vigorous, long-lived tree. Heavy crops coast or inland. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**JANICE SEED-LESS KADOTA FIG** New 'white' fig. Large, sweet, delicious, light greenish-yellow fruit with practically no seeds. Prolonged harvest, August through November at Fremont, Calif. Suited to coastal and inland climates. Prune to any shape. 100 hours. Self-fruitful. Patent Pending.

**KING FIG (Desert King)** Light green 'white' skin, strawberry-colored pulp. Rich flavor, excellent fresh-eating quality. Large breba (spring) crop. Later crop is light in hot climates, heavier in coastal climates. Prune only lightly, occasionally. (Heavy winter pruning removes breba crop.) 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**OSBORNE PROLIFIC FIG** Large fruit with very attractive purplish-brown skin, amber pulp. Especially pleasing flavor. Long-time favorite in cool coastal areas, excellent inland as well. Prune to any shape. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**VIOLETTE DE BORDEAUX FIG** Small to medium size purple-black fruit with a very deep strawberry pulp, a distinctive sweet rich flavor. Brebas are pyriform with a thick, tapering neck; main crop figs are variable often without neck, Medium eye. Excellent fresh or dried. Breba crop, hardy. Good for container culture or small spaces. Zones 5-10.

**WHITE GENOA FIG** Old variety, a favorite in cool coastal areas - also excellent inland. Greenish-yellow skin, amber flesh, distinctive flavor. Prune to any shape. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**NECTA ZEE MINIATURE NECTARINE** Sweet, very flavorful yellow freestone, beautiful red skin. Mid-June to early July in central Calif. Strong, vigorous tree to 6 ft. Best self-fruitful miniature nectarine. 500 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 6283. (Zaiger)

**ARCTIC STAR WHITE NECTARINE** Earliest to ripen of the new low acid, super-sweet white nectarines. Rave reviews in trial tastings. Beautiful dark red skin, snow-white semi-freestone flesh. Ripens mid-June in Central Calif., 4-5 weeks ahead of Arctic Rose. Low winter chilling requirement, about 300 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 9332. (Zaiger)

**DESERT DAWN NECTARINE** Proven heavy producer of delicious nectarines for warm winter western climates. Solid red skin, juicy yellow semi-freestone, rich flavor. Mid to late May. 250 hours. Self-fruitful. (Zaiger)

**DESERT DELIGHT NECTARINE** Proven producer in warm winter climates, and highly recommended as an early season nectarine elsewhere. Large fruit with bright red skin, yellow flesh and delicious, rich, nectarine flavor. Harvest mid-June in Central Calif. 1-200 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 7891. (Zaiger)

**PANAMINT NECTARINE** Attractive red-skinned yellow freestone. Aromatic, intensely flavored, nice acid-sugar balance. Dependable, long-time favorite in warm winter Southern California climates. Late July/early August. 250 hours. Self-fruitful.

**SAUZEE KING NECTARINE** Nectarine From Zaiger hybrids the first donut style nectarine! Outstanding early season variety has white flesh that is sweet and juicy. Tree sets at a young age and produces heavily. Thinning is required for large fruit size. Red skin over a blush of yellow. Chilling requirement unknown estimated at 500 hrs. (Patent Pending)

**SPICE ZEE NECTAPLUM™ INTERSPECIFIC** The first Nectaplum™ from Zaiger Hybrids. SpiceZee packs a pile of amazing fruit flavors into an attractive tree for the home gardener. It is slightly acidic and loaded with sugar giving it a spicy sweet flavor. One can detect both Plum and Nectarine traits with ease. Along with great flavor Spice Zee is a beautiful ornamental tree with a tremendous spring bloom followed by dark red leaf in the spring that matures to a rich green-red in late summer. This variety is self-fruitful and very productive. (Patent Pending)

**BONANZA MINIATURE PEACH** Popular yellow freestone - large fruit is sweet, low in acid, with a mild, refreshing flavor. Mid to late June in Central Calif., earlier in low desert climates. 5-6 ft. tree. Chilling requirement very low, 250 hours or less. Self-fruitful.

**PIX ZEE MINIATURE PEACH** Large fruit ripens mid to late June in Central Calif., two weeks before Honey Babe. Delicious, firm, yellow freestone, beautiful red over orange skin. Vigorous to 6 ft. 500 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 6364. (Zaiger)

**BABCOCK WHITE PEACH** Long-time favorite white-fleshed freestone. Sweet and juicy, aromatic, low in acid. High-scoring in taste tests. Ripens mid-July in Central Calif. Widely adapted (low chill requirement, yet not early blooming). 250-300 hours. Self-fruitful.

**DESERT GOLD PEACH** Very early: May in So. Calif./Ariz. Tree-ripened fruit has good flavor and sweetness for such an early variety. Yellow clingstone. Heavy bearing. 250 hours. Self-fruitful.

**DONUT (Stark Saturn) WHITE PEACH** Also called Saucer or Peento Peach. Unique white-fleshed fruit with a sunken center (shaped like a doughnut). Sweet, with a mild flavor described by some as almond-like. Ripens late June/early July in Central Calif. Estimated chilling requirement 4-500 hours. Self-fruitful.

**EARLIGRANDE PEACH** Medium size low chill peach from Gulf Coast Texas. Yellow semi-freestone. Very early (May). Successful in Phoenix, Ariz. and similar climates. 275 hours. Self-fruitful.

**EVA'S PRIDE PEACH** Delicious, fine-flavored peach with very low-chilling requirement ripens 2-3 weeks before Mid-Pride. Medium to large-sized yellow freestone - also recommended as early season peach for moderate climates - harvest 3 weeks before July Elberta. 1-200 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 7751. (Zaiger)

**JULY (KIM) ELBERTA PEACH** Also called Early Elberta. Reliable heavy crops. Juicy, sweet, very flavorful yellow freestone fruit for canning, freezing, or fresh use. 500 hours. Self-fruitful.

**MAY PRIDE PEACH** Very early-ripening peach for warm winter climates. Ripens in May, about with Desert Gold. Delicious, sweet and tangy, semi-freestone when soft-ripe. Very large for such an early peach. Large, showy pink blossoms. 175-200 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 7775. (Zaiger)

**MID-PRIDE PEACH** Best yellow freestone for warm winter climates of So. Calif., Phoenix, Houston, S.F. Bay Area. Also recommended for Central California for its exceptional flavor and dessert quality. Mid-season. 250 hours. Self-fruitful. (Zaiger)

**RED BARON PEACH** Flowering/fruiting. Large, juicy, firm, richly flavored yellow freestone fruit. Showy double red blossoms. Mid-July. Long-time favorite in Southern California. Low chilling requirement, 250-300 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 4195.

**FLORDAHOME PEAR** Low-chill pear from Florida. Very nice quality: sweet, smooth-textured, juicy, flavorful. Harvest July/August in So. Calif. Early bloom. Chilling requirement less than 400 hours. Partly self-fruitful.

**HOOD PEAR** Very low chilling requirement, inter-fruitful with Flordahome. Large, early season fruit has yellow-green skin and sweet, mild-flavored flesh. Reported to be highly resistant to fireblight. 1-200 hours.

**20TH CENTURY ASIAN PEAR** (Nijisseiki, "Apple Pear") Juicy, sweet, mild-flavored fruit is crisp like apple. Early to mid-August in Central Calif. Keeps well. Easy to grow, heavy bearing small tree. 450 hours. Self-fruitful or poll. by Shinseiki, Bartlett, or other.

**SHINSEIKI ASIAN PEAR** Juicy, sweet, refreshing, crisp like an apple. Easy to grow. Keeps well. Harvest late July/early August in Central Calif. Bright yellow skin. Vigorous, heavy bearing (usually by 2nd year). 350-450 hours. Self-fruitful.

**FUYU PERSIMMON - JIRO** ("Apple Persimmon") Medium size, flat shape, still hard when ripe, non-astringent. Cool or hot climate. Hardy, attractive tree, practically pest free. Fall harvest. 200 hours. Self-fruitful.

**HACHIYA PERSIMMON** Large, deep orange-red, acorn-shaped. Hot summer required to mature the fruit. Sweet, flavorful, astringent until soft-ripe. Mature fruit can be frozen and thawed to ripen. Productive, ornamental. 200 hours. Self-fruitful.

**BEAUTY PLUM** Sweet, flavorful plum, more widely adapted than Santa Rosa (more productive in cool, rainy climates). Red over yellow skin, amber flesh streaked red. Ripens June in Central Calif. 250 hours. Self-fruitful.

**BURGUNDY PLUM** Maroon-colored skin and flesh. Sweet, with little or no tartness and a very pleasing, mild flavor. High taste test scores. Prolonged harvest, mid-July to mid-August in Central Calif. Very productive. Narrow, upright habit. 300 hours. Self-fruitful.

**SANTA ROSA PLUM** Most popular plum in California & Arizona. Juicy, tangy, flavorful. Reddish-purple skin, amber flesh tinged red. Late June in Central Calif. 300 hours. Self-fruitful.

**ITALIAN PRUNE** Large, purple-skin, freestone. Rich flavor, very sweet when fully ripe. Fresh/dried/canned. Vigorous, cold hardy tree. Late bloom. Late summer harvest. 800 hours. Self-fruitful.

**SUGAR PRUNE** Reddish-purple skin, greenish-yellow flesh, very sweet. Used fresh and for canning. Lower chilling requirement than other European prune/plums. 550 hours. Self-fruitful.

**COT-N-CANDY APRIUM® INTERSPECIFIC** Wonderful new fruit from Zaiger Hybrids, early season harvest ripening 1 week later than Flavor Delight Aprium®. White Flesh is extra sweet and juicy, with a plummy aftertaste. Cot-N-Candy's size is 2 to 2 ½ inches on average. Self-fruitful. (Patent Pending)

**FLAVOR DELIGHT APRIUM® INTERSPECIFIC** Apricot-plum hybrid. Resembles an apricot but with a distinctive flavor and texture all its own. High taste-test scores - one of the most flavorful early season fruits. Early June. Very low chilling requirement. Less than 300 hours. Self-fruitful, but biggest crops if pollinated by any apricot. Pat. No. 7090. (Zaiger)

**EMERALD DROP PLUOT® INTERSPECIFIC** Medium to large size with green skin and yellow-orange flesh. Prolonged harvest: early picked fruit is firm, yet juicy sweet. Left to hang, fruit turns greenish-yellow with honey-like orange flesh. Upright tree sets heavy crops once established. Harvest mid-July to late August. Tested as 7HC165. 400 hours. Pollinator required. Pat. No. 14599 (Zaiger)

**FLAVOR GRENADE PLUOT® INTERSPECIFIC** Elongated green fruit with red blush. Crisp texture and explosive flavor. Taste test winner. Hangs on the tree for 4-6 weeks. Pollenize with Japanese plum. Est. 5-600 chill hours.

**FLAVOR KING PLUOT® INTERSPECIFIC** Taste test winner. Unique plum-apricot hybrid with sensational bouquet and sweet, spicy flavor. Reddish-purple skin, crimson flesh. Harvest mid August in Central Calif. Naturally small tree. 4-500 hours. pollenized by Flavor Supreme, Dapple Dandy, Santa Rosa or Late Santa Rosa. Pat. No. 8026. (Zaiger)

**FLAVOROSA PLUOT® INTERSPECIFIC** Deep purple skinned fruit with red flesh. Mild sweet flavor. Ripens end of May. Pollinate with Japanese plum. 400 hours chill required.

**EVERSWEET POMEGRANATE** Very sweet, virtually seedless fruit. (Even immature fruits are sweet.) Red skin, clear (non-staining) juice. Harvest late summer through fall. Coast or inland. 8-10 ft. arching shrub, or train as tree or espalier. Large, showy, orange-red flowers. 150 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 5418

**GARNET SASH POMEGRANATE** Vigorous tree sets big crops of large, dark red fruit with deep-red, partially edible sweet-tart seeds. Can be grown as a shrub or tree and kept any height by summer pruning. Eat fresh or use in cooking. Excellent source of antioxidants. Requires 150-200 chill hours. Self-fruitful.

**KASHMIR BLEND POMEGRANATE** Medium sized pomegranate with light pink-red exterior. Ruby red seeds have intense flavor with no overbearing acidic taste. Plant has a slightly spreading growth habit and can also be grown as a tree. Keep any height with summer pruning. Excellent source of antioxidants - eat fresh or use in cooking. Requires 150-200 chill hours. Self-fruitful.

**PINK SATIN POMEGRANATE** Medium to large size, medium pink to dark red fruit with medium to large, light-pink edible seeds. Wonderful refreshing light-colored juice is non-staining, with a sweet, fruit-punch flavor. Plant is vigorous and can be grown as a shrub or tree and kept any height by summer pruning. Eat fresh, juice or use in salads. Excellent source of antioxidants. Chill requirements 150-200 hours. Self-fruitful.

**RED SILK POMEGRANATE** Medium to large size fruit with a brilliant red silky exterior. Large firm yet edible seeds have a sweet berry flavor and a great acid/sugar balance. Naturally semi-dwarf tree has a slightly-spreading growth habit and sets large crops. Grow as a tree or shrub and keep any height by summer pruning. Excellent source of antioxidants. Eat fresh or use in cooking. 150-200 hours. Self-fruitful.

**SMYRNA QUINCE** Extremely large fruit - light yellow flesh, bright yellow skin. Attractive tree (or multi-stemmed shrub) has dark green foliage, very showy bloom. Tolerates wet soil. 300 hours. Self-fruitful.

**ALL-IN-ONE GENETIC SEMI-DWARF ALMOND** No. 1 almond for home orchards. Heavy crops of soft-shell nuts with sweet, flavorful kernels. Hot summer required to ripen. 15 ft. tree, very winter & frost hardy. 500 hrs. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 4304. (Zaiger)

**MAHAN PECAN** Largest pecan, thin shell, fine quality. Old variety, a parent of most of the newer varieties. Very late maturing, does best in low desert climates. 250 hours. Self-fruitful.

**PAWNEE PECAN** New early harvest variety. Adapted to growing seasons too short for Mahan or Western Schley, such as the northern Central Valley in California. Medium to large, thin-shelled nut. 250 hours. Partly self-fruitful, or plant with Mohawk.

**WESTERN SCHLEY PECAN** Easy to grow, hardy tree. Less fussy about soil and nutrition. Long, tapered, medium-sized, thin-shelled nuts. Fine quality, mid-season. 250 hours. Self-fruitful.

**AMBASSADOR WALNUT** Cold hardy Carpathian hybrid for severe climates, from Idaho. 1 1/4 inch nuts, thin shell, well sealed. Plump, light-colored kernels, excellent flavor. Young trees set heavy crops. 600 hours. Self-fruitful. Pat. No. 4132. (Rootstock: NCB walnut.)

**BLACK MONUKKA SEEDLESS GRAPE** Large, purplish-black, sweet, crisp. Does not require as much summer heat as Thompson. Fresh or raisins. Early mid-season. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**CRIMSON SEEDLESS GRAPE** New late season seedless grape, ripens early October in Fresno, Calif. Medium size, firm, very sweet, excellent quality. Cane prune. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**FANTASY SEEDLESS GRAPE** Large, bluish-black, pale green flesh. Sweet, superb quality. Extremely vigorous vine. Midseason (early August in Fresno, Calif.). Derived from Emperor, Black Rose, Red Malaga, Muscat. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**FLAME SEEDLESS GRAPE** Medium-sized, light red. Crisp, sweet, excellent flavor. For fresh use or raisins. Needs hot summer. Ripe early, before Thompson. Vigorous. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**PERLETTE SEEDLESS GRAPE** Pale green berry is crisp and juicy. Larger than Thompson and two weeks earlier. Requires less summer heat than Thompson to ripen. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**RUBY SEEDLESS GRAPE** Dark red, sweet, crisp, excellent fresh or for raisins. Ripens after Thompson Seedless. Requires less summer heat than Thompson or Flame. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**THOMPSON SEEDLESS GRAPE** Most popular grape in Calif., Ariz. Fresh & raisins. Pale green, very sweet. Thin the clusters for larger berries. Needs plenty of heat. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**CONCORD SEEDLESS GRAPE** American grape, a sport of Concord. Berries very similar to Concord, but seedless (or seeds very rare). Bluish-black skin, green flesh, distinctive Concord flavor. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**SUFFOLK RED SEEDLESS GRAPE** Russian seedless x American. Hardier than European grapes, less heat to ripen. Largest berries of the hybrids. Early, excellent quality. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**CABERNET SAUVIGNON** Late season red wine grape, small, black, strongly flavored berry. Vigorous, upright vine. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**CHARDONNAY GRAPE** For white burgundy wines. Small round berry. Best quality where summers are cool. Vigorous vine, Very cold hardy. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**MERLOT GRAPE** Black berry, used for distinctive red wines. Best quality in cooler regions. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**PINOT NOIR GRAPE** Small black berries that yield the famous French Burgundy wines. Requires cool summers, cane pruning. Early harvest. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**ZINFANDEL GRAPE** For fruity red wines. Medium size, round, juicy, reddish-black berry, early mid-season. Prefers mild winters, cool summer. Heavy bearing. 100 hours. Self-fruitful.

**PRAIRIFIRE™ FLOWERING CRABAPPLE** Crimson buds followed by long-lasting, single, pinkish-red blossoms. Persistent dark red fruit. New foliage reddish-maroon, aging to reddish-green. Highly resistant to fireblight, scab, cedar apple rust and powdery mildew. Tree form is upright, spreading, eventually round. 20 ft. x 20 ft.

**DOUBLE WHITE FLOWERING PEACH** Spectacular, large, snow-white double blossoms. One of the showiest of all flowering trees. Fast growth to 20 ft. x 20 ft. Prune after bloom for best results next year.

**EARLY PINK FLOWERING PEACH** Very early, bright pink blossoms. Used for Chinese New Year in Southern California. Fast growth to 20 ft. x 20 ft. Prune after bloom and again in early summer for profuse bloom following spring.

**EARLY RED FLOWERING PEACH** Vivid purplish-red double flowers, very early. Used in So. Calif. for Chinese New Year. Small, sweet, light green-skinned fruit. Fast growth to 20 x 20 ft. Prune after bloom for best results next year.

**LATE RED FLOWERING PEACH** Magnificent double red flowers. Late bloom, good choice to follow early bloomers or for frost-prone areas. Fast growth to 20 ft. high x 20 ft. wide.

**PEPPERMINT FLOWERING PEACH** Naturally-occurring, artsy assortment of red, white, pink and variegated double flowers. Very showy and unusual. Fast growth to 20 ft. high x 20 ft. wide.

**KRAUTER VESUVIUS FLOWERING PLUM** Dark purple leaves, light pink blossoms, little or no fruit. Relatively small tree, 18' high, 12' wide. Favorite purple-leaf plum for California. Foliage of newly planted trees sometimes greenish until vigorous growth begins.

**THUNDERCLOUD FLOWERING PLUM** Abundant, light pink to white flowers, dark purple leaves. Sometimes has small fruits suitable for jam/jelly. Rounded shape to 20 ft. high x 20 ft. wide.

**BONITA® ASH - Fraxinus velutina 'Bonita'** Broad canopy. Fast growing shade tree. Good performer in the desert southwest. Long lasting yellow fall color. Size to 35 ft. x 35 ft. USDA zone 6.

**FAN TEX™ ASH - Fraxinus velutina 'Fan Tex™'** Superior selection of Arizona ash. Large dark green leaves, symmetrical canopy, fast growing, seedless. Good tree for southwestern desert climates. Budded onto seedling Arizona ash.

**RAYWOOD ASH - Fraxinus oxycarpa 'Raywoodi'** Fast-growing, tolerates heat, cold, alkaline soil. Compact, round-headed. Small, delicate leaves, lacy appearance. Purplish-red fall color. No seeds. 25-35 ft.

**GOLDEN RAIN TREE - Koelreuteria paniculata** Slowly reaches 30 ft. x 30 ft. Open habit, gives light shade. Compound leaves, yellow flower clusters, ornamental seed pods. Tolerates heat, wind, drought, cold, alkaline soil. Sunset zones 2-21.

**GOLDEN HONEYLOCUST - Gleditsia tri. inermis 'Aurea'** Deciduous shade or accent tree with yellow new foliage. Distinctive small leaflets, long seed pods. Tolerates heat, cold, wind, drought, alkaline soil. 40-50 ft. Sunset zones 1-16, 18-20.

**PURPLE ROBE LOCUST - Robinia idahoensis 'Purple Robe'** Shapely deciduous tree to 40 ft. Tolerates heat/cold/poor soil/drought. Small leaflets, reddish new growth. Large, purplish-pink showy flowers, prolonged bloom. Deep watering recommended. All zones.

**PURPLE SMOKE TREE - Cotinus coggygia 'atropurpurea'** Purple foliage, rich purple "smoke": hazy-appearing clusters of fuzzy, purple flower stalks. Multi-trunked shrub or small tree to 20 ft. x 20 ft. Likes cold, needs good drainage, resists oak root fungus. All zones.

**WEeping WILLOW - Salix babylonica** Fast-growing, cold hardy, short dormant period. Long narrow leaves, pronounced weeping growth habit. Needs plenty of water. Stake high to develop usable area underneath. 30 x 30 ft. or larger.

**PAKISTAN FRUITING MULBERRY** Long (3 inches), firm, red to black, sweet syncarpous (like a blackberry) fruit. Non-staining juice. Month-long early summer harvest. Fruit used fresh and for pies, jams and jellies. Large, vigorous, disease-resistant tree.
