Candy Heart Pluerry®



The second addition to the Pluerry® line, Candy Heart is a real treat. Skin is dark speckled red, flesh is amber/red with a wonderful unique flavor. Candy Heart has an extended hang time, but reaches peak ripeness around mid August. Tested as 32MF92. Pollenized by Sweet Treat Pluerry® & Burgundy plum. U.S. Plant patent pending (Zaiger)



Summer Delight Aprium®

Late-season Aprium, ripe late July-Early August. Reliable bearer, great apricot flavor very juicy flesh. Self-fruitful, required chill 500 hours or less, best in zones 7-10 U.S. Plant patent pending (Zaiger)

2016 Additions to the Farmers Market Favorites® Potted Tree Program

Pixwell Gooseberry Large, light green berries that turn pink and sweet when fully ripe. Practically thornless, this variety is relatively easy to pick. Purple fall color makes this a good choice as an edible ornamental. Mildew resistant, thriving in partial shade in hot summer areas. Adaptable to warmer winter climates. Zone 4-9. Self-fruitful.

Pomegranates

Three new pomegranate additions from the National Clonal Germplasm Repository at Wolfskill. **Ariana**- Sweet-tart, with great flavor and medium to large sized fruit. Red rind with dark red arils and very soft seeds. This variety came from Dr. Gregory Levin when he was stationed at the Turkmenistan Experimental Station of Plant Genetic Resources, Garrygala. **Cranberry**- Bears heavy crops of large, cranberry red fruit, with a light red, rich sour juice. **Eve**- Large, red fruit with deep red arils. Hard seeds that yield red juice with good sweet-acid balance.

Geneva® 935 Rootstock

A new apple rootstock selected as a replacement for Bud-9. Geneva 935 is very cold hardy and fireblight resistant, while dwarfing apple trees to 8' to 10'. Very popular with commercial growers. 14 apple varieties available on this rootstock for 2016.
